3. Marketing & Digital Communication

The Old Paulians' Association utilised several digital channels to communicate with members and the wider community. These included the Association's website, social media platforms such as Instagram, TikTok, Facebook and LinkedIn, WhatsApp marketing, as well as influencer marketing initiatives.

The content strategy focused on producing a variety of digital materials, including posts, videos, reels and stories. Photos and videos were created with key messages tailored to reach the Association's targeted audiences and to enhance engagement across all platforms.

In terms of engagement, the Association's Facebook page has 4,100 followers and records an average of 116,840 visitors per month as of January 2026. TikTok has 122 followers with an average engagement of approximately 1,900 visitors per month, while Instagram has 186 followers with an average engagement of about 2,000 visitors per month[U1.1].

Moving forward, the Association aims to increase its social media followers and overall engagement across all platforms by 15% within the next six months.

4. Sports & Games

i) Badminton:

- a) The OPA Badminton Tournament was successfully held on 12 July 2025 at the Tunas Badminton Sports Centre, bringing together Paulians for an evening of friendly competition and camaraderie. The tournament was open to past and current students of SPI, who competed in the doubles category. Participants showcased not only their badminton skills but also the strong spirit of fellowship that continues to unite the Paulian community across generations.

Throughout the day, matches were played with great enthusiasm and sportsmanship, with teams battling it out for top honours. The event also provided a wonderful opportunity for alumni and students to reconnect, share memories, and strengthen bonds through sport.

The Old Paulians' Association (OPA), an affiliate member of NSBA, was represented by 29 members who competed in both the President Cup and the NSBA Cup, fielding two teams in each category. It is also noteworthy that two OPA members, Mr. Lee Nam Yew (C1977) and Mr. Loh Yah Shang (C1978) currently serve on the NSBA Committee.

5. SPI Primary School Report

Report was presented by Pn. Margret Easiah, Headmistress of SPI Primary on 12th February 2026 at the 12th OPA Management Meeting, as below:-

The school currently has a total enrolment of 710 students, representing an increase of about 20% compared to the previous year. This includes 130 students in Year One. The school operates 24 classes from Standard One to Standard Six. There are 100 girls enrolled from Standard One to Standard Three. The teaching staff currently numbers 49 teachers, although the school is still short of four teachers.

Looking ahead, a double intake is expected in 2027 following the policy allowing students to enter Primary One at the age of six. To accommodate the anticipated increase in enrolment, the school will require additional classrooms and furniture. The school welcomes and greatly appreciates contributions towards the repair, refurbishment, and improvement of its facilities.

6. SPI Secondary School Report

i) Achievements In The Field of Students Affairs – Academic Year 2025

Student Affairs Unit focused on fostering leadership and character through key events like the Prefectorial Camp, leadership transition ceremonies, and the annual Graduation and Best Student awards. A major highlight was the appointment of five students to state-level positions in the Majlis Perwakilan Kanak-Kanak, demonstrating the school's success in nurturing youth voices. Overall, these initiatives reinforced the school's commitment to developing disciplined, high-performing student leaders through both internal recognition and external representation.

ii) Achievements In Co-Curricular – Academic Year 2025 (International Level)

The 2025 academic year has been a landmark period for SPI Secondary, characterized by an extraordinary display of talent, discipline, and sportsmanship across all co-curricular frontiers. From the karate mats and swimming pools of international arenas to the competitive debating stages and hockey fields at the state level, our students have consistently demonstrated excellence. This report provides a comprehensive overview of the significant achievements garnered by our young athletes and scholars, reflecting the school's commitment to holistic development and its rising profile in both sporting and academic competitions.

a) International Level

Several students excelled in combat sports, aquatics, and dance:

- Karate: Darshween Kumar (3 Austin) was crowned Champion at the 33rd MAKAF International Championship, while Saarvathman Kalaiarasu secured third place.
- Water Polo: Aragorn Sta Maria (2 Anselm) and Keegan Lucas Sta Maria (1 Anselm) achieved multiple top-three finishes, including a Championship at the 66th Milo-MAS Malaysia Open and the 2nd National Interclub President Cup.
- Swimming: Lee Hong Jie (3 Austin) and Cayden Teo Kae-C (3 Anselm) dominated various events (Breaststroke, Backstroke, and Individual Medley) at the MSSM Aquatic Championship and SportExcel circuits.
- Other Sports: Delwin Abdul Rashid (4 Casimir) won the 12th Speed Power International Open Taekwondo, and Elvis Long Yen Xu (3 Austin) was a Runner-Up in the Negeri Sembilan International Dancesport Championship.

b) National Level

The school showed strong performance in badminton and specialized sports:

- Badminton: Putera Raees Rafael (2 Anselm) and Chan Jun Hung (2 Austin) won multiple titles in the AAFIN & 100 Plus series and MSSD Seremban 1 championships.
- Shooting & Fencing: Niveethaan Anthony (5 Austin) secured Runner-Up in the Malaysian Junior Shooting Championship (Pistol), and Hiew Kim Yung (5 Dominic) placed third in the NS Youth Challenge Fencing.
- Hockey: Raivinder Singh and Muhammad Amir Imran from St Paul's were part of the Champion team at the Under 17, NHDP Hockey Carnival.

c) State & District Level

The school maintained a high standard in local competitions:

- Team Sports: The school won the Water Polo and Team Champion titles at the Negeri Sembilan MSS Aquatic Championship. The Under-18 Hockey team and Under-15 Table Tennis team also secured State Championships.
- Academic & Skills:
- Champions: State Level Secondary School English Debate, Innovative Sustainability Challenge (ISC), and the Young Innovators Challenge "Maker Fair."
- Tamil Language: A team consisting of Krishen, Sharvesh, and Pavithran won the Seremban 1 District level and was Runner-Up at the State level for the Youth Forum Competition.
- Athletics: Anushivan Vijian and Visvajid Kuhan achieved several podium finishes in hurdles and relay races at the MSS Negeri Sembilan Athletics Championship.

7. Finance and Welfare**i) Brother Felix Donohue Student Welfare Fund**

The Brother Felix Donohue (BFD) Student Welfare Fund was initiated in 2010 by the Class of 1970 in conjunction with the 40th anniversary of their departure from their alma mater. This private initiative was established to provide financial assistance to needy Form 6 students of SPI with academic potential through the Old Paulians' Association. Recipients were selected based on their academic performance and family income. Following the cessation of Form 6 classes in SPI with effect from 2022, the Class of 1970, has agreed for the donations to be channelled instead to needy Form 5 students with academic potential.

As of 31st Dec 2025 the balance in the Fund stands at RM 186,912 after a total payout of RM 14,655 through the year.

ii) Class 1978 Students Welfare Fund

This initiative was started by a group of generous donors from the Class of 1978 with the objective of providing a monthly allowance to needy students in both SPI Secondary and SPI Primary schools.

As at 31 December 2025, the balance in the Fund stands at RM104,934, after receiving additional donations and bank interest amounting to RM2,751.

iii) The Ammal Chacko Vocational Trust Fund (ACVTF)

The fund was initiated by Mr John Chacko (Class of 1973) in honour of his parents in year 2024. The ACVTF aims to assist academically challenged students from the B40 group in pursuing vocational education.

In 2025, the fund was also extended to support two additional programmes benefiting students in SPI Primary. One of these, Program Bintang Harapan, initiated by the PTA and in its third year in 2025, aims to provide additional support to students who are lagging their peers in the 3M skills (Membaca, Menulis dan Mengira). A total of RM5,600 was paid out for the programme, covering the honorarium for the volunteer teachers as well as the learning materials.

The other programme sponsored by the Fund was Rancangan Dapur Kasih. This project was started when it was brought to Mr Chacko's attention that there are underprivileged students who goes to school without breakfast and can't afford the food in the school canteen. Dapur Kasih ensure that underprivileged students receive supplementary food assistance, thereby safeguarding their welfare and health. Thirty students were sponsored in 2025. Mr Chacko has also agreed to continue supporting both programmes in 2026.

As at 31 December 2025, the balance in the Fund stands at RM 7,710.00 after a total pay-out of RM 18,410.

iv) The LSC Tertiary Students Welfare Fund (LSCTSWF)

This fund was generously donated by the late Mr Lee Siew Chow, who pledged his fixed deposit savings to OPA as trustee. The establishment of the LSCTSWF is intended to assist and support needy and deserving students with good academic results in commencing their tertiary education. No students were identified to receive the one-off RM3,000 scholarship in 2025. Greater efforts will be made to promote the availability of this Fund to encourage applications in 2026. The Fund aims to sponsor 3 students in year 2026.

As at 31 December 2025, the balance in the Fund stands at RM 20,000.00

8. Building & Facilities

i) Building Maintenance and Upgrading

Building maintenance, upgrading, and general upkeep of the premises have been carried out regularly to ensure that the facilities remain in good condition. Notable additions include a new 3 HP air-conditioning unit, a bookshelf, additional CCTV cameras, and a 43-inch Smart TV.

Plans have also been made to trim several trees within the vicinity of Paulian House for safety reasons, and to extend the covered portion of the porch.

ii) Activities at Paulian House

1. Paulian House (PH) serves as the main venue for all OPA Management Committee and planning meetings.
2. Apart from the monthly first Saturday Kopitime, OPA also hosted various joyous cultural celebrations and festivals at Paulian House, including Deepavali, Christmas, and Chinese Lunar New Year.
3. On 3 May 2025, a Free Basic Social Media Training session was organised at Paulian House for OPA members. The programme was attended by 23 enthusiastic participants. During the session, participants were introduced to the basic navigation and use of popular social media platforms, including Facebook, Instagram, and TikTok, with the aim of helping them better understand and utilise these platforms for communication and engagement.
4. On 7 June 2025, the Old Paulians' Association (OPA) hosted a Kopitiam breakfast at Paulian House attended by 75 members and guests. The event featured an informative talk by Dr James Willis on the dangers of nano plastics and the importance of reducing single-use plastics. Participants also attended a life-saving CPR and AED demonstration conducted by the St. John Ambulance Kajang team and benefited from a free health check-up provided by the NS Health Council. The morning combined fellowship, learning, and health awareness, and OPA expressed its appreciation to Dato' Dr Bob Samuel, Dato Lai See Ming, Dr James Willis, St. John Ambulance Kajang, and the NS Health Council for their contributions.
5. Paulian House continues to serve as a common meeting point for both local and overseas members to reconnect, hold casual meet-ups, and organise gatherings. Various year groups have also continued to host their events and activities at Paulian House. Class of 1987 hosted a Teachers' Appreciation Lunch on 14 June 2025 at Paulian House. The gathering brought together 10 former teachers and 10 alumni, providing a warm opportunity to reminisce and share stories from their school days as well as experiences after graduation. It was a joyful and meaningful occasion where teachers took pride in the achievements of their former students, while the alumni expressed their heartfelt appreciation to the teachers who had guided and shaped their journey.
6. OPA members may make bookings to use Paulian House through the Hon. Secretary. While there is currently no fixed rental fee, members who utilise Paulian House are encouraged to make a donation to OPA to help defray maintenance and cleaning costs.

10. Strategic Partnership & Alumni Activation

i) 2025 Membership

2025 marked the strongest membership growth in recent history — 89 new Life Members recruited, compared to 41 in 2024, 200% year-on-year.

This was not the result of a single initiative, but a collective, sustained effort across multiple touchpoints throughout the year:

- a) Monthly breakfast signups — consistent pipeline built through regular engagement
- b) 99th OPA Annual Dinner — a record 28 new members onboarded in a single event
- c) School leavers programme — capturing members at the earliest entry point into the alumni community

ii) Strategic Partnerships

OPA members now benefit from a growing portfolio of corporate partnerships, delivering tangible value through the OPA membership card. This portfolio continues to be developed, with further collaborations in the pipeline. In addition:

- a) LinkedIn (New Initiative, 2025) — a new platform launched by OPA to target former alumni who are working professionals, growing to 135 followers YTD. To our knowledge, the only Lasallian alumni association on LinkedIn in Malaysia.
- b) Corporate Memberships — OPA has been linking up with companies that offer special corporate rates and privileges to members. Current partnerships include Arena Premier Boutique Hotel, Aurelius Hospital Negeri Sembilan, CMH Specialist Hospital, PEMMS Pest Control, Coffee & Dreams, and Uncle Don's.

11. OPA's 99th Annual Reunion Dinner

The 99th Annual Reunion Dinner was held on 6 September 2025 and was a joyous occasion attended by more than 1,200 guests. The Guest of Honour was our Patron, YB Anthony Loke. Also present were representatives of the Lasallian Mission, Bro. Andrew Loke and Bro. Butch.

Among the distinguished attendees were Dato' Dr. Bob Samuel, Chairman of the SPI Secondary Board of Governors; Ms Ng Ai Ching, Principal of SPI Secondary; Pn. Margret Easiah, Headmistress of SPI Primary; Mr Michael Simon, President of MFOLSA; and Mr Lim Hock Thiam, Chairman of the Malaysian Lasallian Mission Council. The event was also graced by guests from various Lasallian alumni associations throughout Malaysia.

The Old Paulians' Association (OPA) is proud to announce the inaugural recipients of the 2025 OPA Golden Eagle Awards. This year marks the historic first time this award has been introduced, representing the highest honour conferred by the association to recognize individuals who have demonstrated exceptional commitment and service to the broader Paulian community.

We extend our heartiest congratulations to four distinguished recipients whose decades of unwavering loyalty have set an inspiring benchmark for all. Leading the honours is Mr. Ng Yee Tim; our Patron with over 56 years of dedicated service. He is joined by Dato' Lai See Ming, recognized for 45 years of service, as well as Mr. Lee Kok Keong and Mr. Michael Thong Kai Tung, both of whom have contributed over 42 years of leadership to the association.

The Tan Sri Dato' Chan Choong Tak Award, which honours the year's best all-rounder student, was recently presented to Ryan Hiew Jie An at the Annual Reunion Dinner. This prestigious accolade recognizes excellence across multiple disciplines and serves as a tribute to the legacy of the late Tan Sri Dato' Chan Choong Tak.

The award includes a commemorative plaque, a certificate of achievement and a cash prize, generously sponsored by the late Tan Sri's family. Furthermore, as a mark of continued connection to the Paulian community, Ryan was also granted OPA Life Membership upon his graduation from school.

12. Registrar of Societies (ROS) Inquiry:

Last year, our Association faced an unprecedented situation when we were called upon by the Registrar of Societies (ROS) for a review of our records. On 22 August 2025, shortly before our 99th OPA Annual Reunion Dinner, OPA were summoned by ROS to facilitate a comprehensive examination of the Association's documentation. This was the first such occurrence in nearly a century of the Association's existence.

We were requested to present in person and to submit documentation covering the previous two years, including accounts, bank statements, membership lists, minutes of meetings, and other records, amounting to 15 specific requirements. While we initially understood this to be a routine regulatory review, we were later informed that it was initiated following a complaint lodged by a member of the OPA, Michael Soh Kong Fai (Class of 1980).

The complaint raised several allegations relating to financial management, requests for a forensic audit, honorarium payments, and the maintenance of a RM1,000,000 reserve fund. Throughout the process, the OPA cooperated fully with the authorities and provided all requested documentation to demonstrate transparency and proper governance.

Following the review, the investigating officer from PDRM assigned to assist ROS expressed satisfaction with the explanations and documentation provided, and acknowledged the Association's commitment to proper record-keeping and governance practices.

Members may recall that Michael Soh had previously published an article in FMT criticising the OPA following our AGM in April last year. While differences of opinion may arise within any organisation, the Association remains committed to addressing matters responsibly while upholding the spirit of fellowship and camaraderie that has long defined Paulians.

The Association has publicly addressed the allegations and reaffirmed its commitment to transparency, accountability, and the protection of OPA's reputation. Relevant Lasallian stakeholders, including the Lasalle Brothers, the Board of Governors, the Federation, and our Lasallian affiliates, have also been informed.

As we approach our 100th anniversary this year, the OPA will continue to serve the Paulian community with integrity, transparency, and pride, honouring the rich legacy of our alma mater.

13. Malaysian Federation of La Sallian Alumni Associations ("The MFOLSA")

The Old Paulians' Association (OPA) continues to maintain a highly active and strategic involvement with the Malaysian Federation of Lasallian Alumni Associations (MFOLSA). Beyond regularly sending representatives to attend annual dinners and federation meetings, the OPA's commitment is further reflected by its significant presence on the MFOLSA Board for the 2025–2027 term.

Joint Activities with MFOLSA

a) Lasallian Alumni Veteran Hockey Carnival

The Inter-Lasallian Alumni Veteran Hockey Carnival, held on 7 February 2026 at the St. Paul's Primary School field, brought together Paulians, Lasallians, former hockey greats, supporters, and friends for a day of fellowship and sport. Organised with the support of MFOLSA and the Old Paulians' Association (OPA), the carnival featured teams from St. Paul's Institution, St. John's Institution, and La Salle Petaling Jaya. The event was graced by several hockey legends, including Olympian and former national captain Stephen Van Huizen, along with other distinguished players from the participating schools. A special highlight was the surprised appearance of Federal Court Judge, Justice Dato Colin Sequerah who joined in the fun and loved the Lasallian spirit. The 2025 Lasallian Alumni Veteran Hockey Carnival champion went to SPI A Team. The day concluded with an exhibition match where the Lasallian All Stars defeated the school Under-14 team 2–0.

The organisers expressed appreciation to the school authorities, volunteers, and supporters who made the event possible, emphasising that the carnival's true purpose was to celebrate Lasallian fellowship, shared memories, and the enduring bonds within the alumni community.

b) Inter Lasallian Games:

SPI emerged as the Overall Champion of the Games held on 14 July 2018. As the champion, SPI was accorded the honour of hosting the subsequent Games. However, due to various COVID-19 restrictions and other challenges, the Games have not been held since.

The next Games are currently being planned to be hosted by SPI Secondary, and are tentatively scheduled for 22 August 2026, subject to approval from BSKK, KPM. The final date will be confirmed and announced in due course.
